And since a very large number of university professors actually work only at the limits of knowledge while writing university teaching and teaching materials, but do not create anything originally, their study writing activities can already be done largely with the help of ChatGPT4o. But not in months and years, but in hours, days and weeks.

Here, just asking questions is a human intellectual additive to ChatGPT4o, but of course a series of consecutive questions on a given topic is fundamental to what the result of knowledge mining will be from the total knowledge of artificial intelligence on the topic. I myself have written studies in broad legal science (legal theory, legal dogmatics, legal history), sociological theory, sociology of law, political sociology, sociology of science and political science in the past 45 years, and I have already undergone preliminary studies for a multitude of questions in knowledge mining. But even on a general intellectual knowledge base, practically the entire field of social and historical sciences can be used by anyone to ask a series of deepening, interconnected questions on a given topic, and thus mine study-level knowledge from the total knowledge of ChatGPT4o. It should be pointed out, of course, that I have already read studies for some of the mind investigations here, although they were only intended to help me understand other contexts, but I could not have undertaken to undertake an independent study in this field, even at the level of summarising knowledge. But now for ChatGPT4o to ask questions, they were useful, so I was a little beyond the level of general intellectual knowledge in this area.

In this volume I look at the world of secret services with the help of the ChatGPT4o version, and after discussing the general issues, I collect the analyses of works repeating the secret services of certain states and some great powers in large regions of the world. Thus, similarly to the previous volumes, this one aims to be a new way of gaining knowledge, a higher-level

This integration enables efficient information sharing and rapid response to emerging threats.
2. **Advanced management and technology:**
 - The study notes that Morocco uses a range of advanced surveillance technologies, including facial recognition systems, phone tapping and widespread use of CCTV cameras. These tools help intelligence services monitor and neutralize threats before they become actual acts of terrorism.
3. **Human intelligence and community engagement:**
 - Beyond technology Morocco its counterterrorism efforts are supported by powerful human intelligence networks. The country's security apparatus actively engages with local communities to gather information and build trust, which is critical to preventing radicalisation and identifying potential extremists.

4. Legal and judicial framework:

- The research underlines the importance of Morocco's legal framework in supporting counter-terrorism efforts. Significant investments have been made in training judges and law enforcement officers to deal with terrorism cases effectively and with respect for human rights. This framework ensures that those involved in terrorism are brought to justice fairly and swiftly.

5. International cooperation:

- Githens-Mazer stresses its role as Morocco key player in international counterterrorism cooperation. The country has developed strong partnerships with Western and African nations, facilitating intelligence exchange and cooperation in counterterrorism operations. Morocco's approach is seen as a model for other nations facing similar threats, particularly in its ability to balance security needs with human rights considerations.

6. Challenges and criticisms:

- The study also addresses some of the challenges Morocco faces, including allegations of human rights abuses by security forces. These issues risk undermining Morocco's long-term effectiveness of its counter-terrorism strategy if not properly addressed.

Conclusion:

Githens-Mazer concludes that Morocco intelligence and security services are an effective model for counterterrorism cooperation. The country's mix of technological innovation, strong legal framework, and international cooperation has made it one of the region's most successful nations in preventing terrorist attacks. However, the study also warns that continued efforts to improve human rights practices within security services are key to sustaining this success in the long term.
